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Resolutions:

Approving Time Extension of Use Permit UPR-5-17-12820 — Temporary Storage of New Automobiles on Vacant Drive In-Theater Site at 607 Carter Street

Councilmember Buenaventura questioned whether sufficient progress is being made with regard to economic development at the subject site, and whether the subject project is delaying the progress and revitalization of the Bayshore community. For the extension to occur, Council requested a report or update from the owner on the development progress at the site.

Planning Manager Michael Van Lonkhuysen provided background for the use permit that was initially granted to owner Sywest Properties in 2017 with a three-year term for the use with an ability to extend the permit for up to two years. Bill Vierra, Sywest Properties, requested Council to consider the extension for the use permit and reported on meeting with City staff and Bridge Housing for potential development and looking to collaborate with Bridge Housing to unlock the other two parcels on that site.

Director of Economic Development Tatum Mothershead reported on Bridge applying for and recently being awarded \$500,000 redevelopment funds from San Mateo County. Staff addressed Council questions. Council provided Sywest more time to make a presentation of its proposed plan for the subject site at an upcoming Council meeting.

It was moved by Councilmember Buenaventura, seconded by Councilmember Sylvester and carried by unanimous roll call vote to continue the item to the regular City Council meeting of March 22, 2021.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Public Hearing - Proposed Temporary New Fee for Upper Level Swim Lessons at Giammona Pool

Recreation Services Supervisor Chris Mariano provided background of the services that have been affected by the pandemic. Mr. Mariano presented a proposal to temporarily change the subject fee from \$66 to \$80 for residents and from \$81 to \$95 for non-residents during the pandemic. Mr. Mariano assured Council that staff is trained to ensure swimmers participating in the modified swim lessons remain safe. A survey taken of 142 active residents in the system showed that 85% would pay the higher fee at this time, while 75% said they would be willing to join on the days proposed.

Staff addressed questions on the following matters: the survey results, how much revenue will be generated based on the increase, whether the increased fee will cover cost recovery, whether there are discounts provided for underprivileged youth, the condition of ventilation inside the pool facility, pre-registration requirements and COVID disclosure forms.

It was moved by Councilmember Sylvester, seconded by Councilmember DiGiovanni and carried to open the public hearing. There were no speakers on this matter.

Use Permit (UPR-12-20-014817) Renewal to Allow Automotive Repair at 7338A Mission Street

Planning Manager Michael Van Lonkhuysen presented the applicant's proposal to allow an automotive repair garage at the subject site which currently provides thirty parking spaces. Staff recommended the condition that the applicant discloses in its property lease(s) that it is prohibited by law for any person or any business to continuously feed the parking meters beyond the designated time and the City will cite such an offense.

It was moved by Councilmember DiGiovanni, seconded by Councilmember Sylvester and carried by unanimous roll call vote to adopt the following resolution

Resolution 21-18, Adopting Findings of Fact and Imposing Conditions of Approval on Use Permit UPR-12-20-014817 to Allow Automotive Repair (7338A Mission Street, Daly City, California)

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PUBLIC APPEARANCES/ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

Nick Occhipinti, Daly City teacher, requested a copy of the commercial cannabis overlay ordinance be provided for public review. Although he supports having cannabis dispensaries for adults, Mr. Occhipinti asked Council to keep in mind the health and safety of the youth who will be walking along School Street and urged Council to remove the cannabis zoning at that particular location.

Mikio Akima, Daly City Prevention Collaborative, requested the City to place a 1,000-foot buffer around schools when selecting commercial cannabis retail locations. Mr. Akima was concerned for youth at risk of exposure to cannabis, particularly exposure to cannabis edibles due to their close likeness to snacks that are commonly consumed by youth. He asked edibles to be properly labeled by retailers to avoid these potential dangers.

Mayor Manalo announced creating a Social Justice Issues Subcommittee to receive feedback from community members.

City Council

Councilmember DiGiovanni reported attendance at the Black History Month celebration, thanking Leslie DuBridge, Denise Brown and the Recreation Department. Councilmember DiGiovanni also attended the Cars, Cops and Coffee family event at Serramonte Center with the community and Daly City Police Department, thanking Serramonte Manager Marie Villarosa. Mayor Manalo reminded the public of the following key dates: on February 27th, Council will hold its retreat to review the Council's annual goals and priorities; on March 15th, a virtual townhall will be held for community input; and on March 22nd, the State of the Cities will occur. From late April to early May, the City will hold budget discussions and Council approval on the next budget cycle, wherein the public will have an opportunity to provide input. Mayor Manalo thanked Vice Mayor Daus-Magbual for bringing to light the continuity of xenophobia and the rise of hate crimes towards Asians and Asian Americans in the Bay Area and the nation; the public can view this on the City's website. Mayor Manalo congratulated Leslie DuBridge on the successful Black History Month event and thanked staff for putting together the City's first Lunar New Year Event with Daly City's West Lion Troop. The League of Cities held a seminar on the potential federal dollars that are coming to cities and municipalities, noting the importance of being aware of funding that can go towards COVID-19 recovery. Lastly, the Mayor reported on looking at hazard pay for Daly City's grocery store workers soon.

ADJOURNMENT:

At 9:28 PM, Mayor Manalo adjourned the meeting in memory of Marilyn Rosekind, John E. Dilag, Theodore Tronoff, Gernam Dhaliwal, Wonder Marie Moody, Troy Buzzell and for the 500,000 plus lives that have perished from the coronavirus.

Subject: Approval of Ordinance Amending Chapter 10.12 of the Daly City Municipal Code – Speed Limits

Recommended Action

Staff recommends that the City Council:

1. Conduct the public hearing;
2. Adopt Resolution to Approve the Engineering and Traffic Study 2021; and
3. Introduction of Ordinance to amend Chapter 10.12 of the Daly City Municipal Code – Speed Limits.

Background

The California Vehicle Code requires that an engineering and traffic study be performed to establish appropriate speeds on local streets and allow enforcement of speed limits by the use of radar. The last Daly City Engineering and Traffic Study was prepared in 2010.

Radar surveys of all arterial and collector streets under the City's jurisdiction, along with certain business and residential streets, were performed by the Daly City Police Department, in accordance with the guidelines established in the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

Discussion

In the absence of special conditions, speed limits must be set at or near what is known as the 85th percentile or "critical" speed, which is the speed at which 85% of the vehicles sampled in the survey are traveling at or below. Speed limits may be set a maximum of five miles per hour (5 mph) below the 85th percentile for other conditions which are not readily known to the motorist such as a high crash frequency, high pedestrian volumes, sight visibility limitations, or a high density of cross traffic from driveways or other conflicts. In addition, frequent speed changes along stretches of roadway are also avoided to prevent potential speed traps or driver confusion.

The City's engineering staff evaluated the speed surveys for various City streets and has developed recommended speed limits as shown on the attached Table 1. The new speed surveys indicate that the majority of the existing speed limits are justified. The speed limits along four roadway segments are recommended to be decreased since the last speed survey.

1. **Hickey Boulevard**, from Gellert Boulevard to East City Limit
 - Existing posted speed: 35 mph
 - Recommended posted speed: 30 mph

2. **John Daly Boulevard**, from Junipero Serra Boulevard to Mission Street
 - Existing posted speed: 35 mph
 - Recommended posted speed: 30 mph
3. **Junipero Serra Boulevard**, from Colma City Limit to John Daly Boulevard
 - Existing posted speed: 35 mph
 - Recommended posted speed: 30 mph
4. **St. Francis Boulevard**, from Eastmoor Avenue to Serramonte Boulevard
 - Existing posted speed: 30 mph
 - Recommended posted speed: 25 mph

These corridors, with the exception of St. Francis Boulevard, are part of the City's Vision Zero High Injury Network, where a high concentration of fatalities or serious injuries for pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists occurred. The severity of a crash is tied to the speed of the vehicles involved. As a result, strategies that reduce speeds, including reducing posted speed limits, can result in fewer crashes and less severe crashes. The posted speed limit on St. Francis Boulevard is recommended to be lowered to 25 mph because it is primarily a residential street with a mix of Class 2 and 3 bicycle facilities.

All other streets will maintain their current posted speed limit. The recommendations were reviewed, discussed, and approved by the City's Public Works, Police Department, and Economic and Community Development staff. The ordinance will reorganize the listed speed limits. Some roadway segments were combined, some were deleted and the limits of some roadway segments were updated.

Fiscal Impact

The required speed limit sign changes will be funded from the approved operating budget of the Public Works Department, Street Maintenance Division.

Summary/Conclusion

Staff recommends that the City Council:

1. Conduct the public hearing;
2. Adopt Resolution to Approve the Engineering and Traffic Study 2021; and
3. Introduction of Ordinance to amend Chapter 10.12 of the Daly City Municipal Code – Speed Limits.

Staff is available to provide any additional information desired by the Mayor or City Council Members.

Executive Summary

The California Vehicle Code (CVC) Section 40802 requires that each jurisdiction conduct an engineering and traffic survey every five years to establish speed limits for selected streets. If a registered engineer determines that no significant changes in roadway or traffic conditions have occurred, the engineering and traffic surveys are valid for 10 years. This report was prepared to comply with this requirement.

Speed surveys were taken for representative street segments in 2016, 2017, 2020 and 2021 using a radar unit. This data was then, evaluated to identify the prevailing reasonable speed. Visibility restrictions, speed consistency among adjacent segments, crash history, high turn movements and other conditions not readily apparent to motorists were also considered in determining the Recommended Speed Limits.

Speed surveys were conducted only for major arterials, collector and street segments not within residential or business districts. Prima Facie speed limit of 25 mph is recommended for street segments in residential and business districts as provided for in the CVC. Similar Prima Facie speed limits are recommended for all alleys and street segments fronting school grounds. The new speed surveys indicate that the existing speed limits are justified. The following speed limits are recommended to be decreased since the last speed survey in 2010.

- *Hickey Boulevard (between Gellert Boulevard and East City Limit) from 35 mph to 30 mph;*
- *John Daly Boulevard (between Junipero Serra Boulevard and Mission Street) from 35 mph to 30 mph;*
- *Junipero Serra Boulevard (between Colma City Limit and John Daly Boulevard) from 35 mph to 30 mph; and*
- *St. Francis Boulevard (between Eastmoor Avenue to Serramonte Boulevard) from 30 mph to 25 mph.*

Chapter 1: Introduction

This document constitutes an engineering and traffic survey required for establishing speed limits other than the prima facie limit. The Engineering and Traffic Study has been performed for the City of Daly City by the Public Works/Engineering Division of the City of Daly City. The basic purpose of this study is to review and recommend appropriate speed limits for various streets within the City's jurisdiction and allow radar enforcement of City speed limits within Daly City's jurisdiction.

Chapter 7 of Division 11 of the State of California Vehicle Code addresses speed laws. It provides the prima facie speed limit of 15 mph on any alley and within 100 feet of uncontrolled intersections as described in Section 22352 of the State Vehicle Code. The prima facie speed limit of 25 mph is prescribed for streets within business and residential districts in Sections 235 and 515, respectively. CVC Sections 22352, 22357 and 22358 allow the city, upon the basis of an engineering and traffic survey, to establish speed limits on local streets to facilitate the orderly movement of vehicular traffic. Such speed limit may be set at 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50, 60 or a maximum of 65 mph.

The engineering and traffic survey is defined in CVC Section 627 as being a survey of prevailing speeds, collision records, and highway and traffic conditions, in accordance with methods determined by the Department of Transportation for use by State and location authorities.

In the engineering and traffic survey, consideration must be given to the roadside conditions not readily apparent to the driver, residential density, pedestrian and bicycle safety. Chapter 2 of the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (CA MUTCD) 2014 Edition, Revision 5 outlines methods of conducting an engineering and traffic survey. Guidelines contained in this publication have been used in the preparation of this report.

In addition to the above requirements, CVC Section 40805, "Speed Trap" does not allow the use of radar for speed limit enforcement unless the speed limit is justified by an engineering and traffic survey conducted within the last five (5) years.

This report and the procedures used to formulate its recommendations fully meet the requirements of the California Vehicle Code and the California Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, and will allow the Police Department of the City of Daly City to enforce speed limits by the use of radar, following the acceptance of the report and its recommended speed limits by the City Council. Recommended speed limits are included in Chapter 3 of this study.

Chapter 2: Study Procedures

Selection of Locations

As the police often enforce speed limits on City streets utilizing radar, it was determined important to survey all arterial, collector and streets not contiguous to schools, senior centers, business or residential districts, as defined in CVC Sections 235 and 515.

The principle feature of the survey was radar speed check described in the following section. Speed survey data was collected at sufficient locations to ensure that various street sections with differing characteristics were surveyed. In addition, a representative street or streets from each of the residential neighborhoods in the City were surveyed to enable the establishment of speed limits on the local street system.

Radar Checks

Radar checks were made on all street sections in which the traffic speeds, the traffic volumes, the street width or other significant factors were different from an adjacent section. Thus, certain streets required speed surveys at several locations to account for changes in these factors, whereas streets with consistent traffic conditions needed just one survey check. Each of the radar speed checks was made from a speed trailer sign. The trailer sign did not display the recorded speed in an effort to ensure that the motorists were not affected by the presence of the speed trailer. In order to obtain a significant sample, wherever possible, the speeds of at least fifty (50) vehicles in each direction, or one hundred (100) vehicles total, were recorded utilizing accepted survey techniques.

Analysis of Data

The Engineering Analysis and Traffic Survey information for various street segments are attached at the end of this report. The engineering analysis is based upon the field survey forms which include information, such as the location of the spot speed survey, the direction of travel of vehicles surveyed, the weather condition, the day of the week, and the date and time of survey. Engineering analysis of each speed survey comprised of determining the 50th percentile speed, the 85th percentile speed and the 10 mph pace speed.

The 50th percentile speed is the speed at or below which 50 percent of the sample speeds lie. This is also known as the median or middle speed. The 85th percentile speed or “critical” speed is that speed at or below which 85 percent of the observed vehicles are traveling. It is generally recognized that at least 85 percent of the drivers operate at speeds which are reasonable and prudent for the conditions pertaining to each situation. Therefore, the 85th percentile speed of a spot speed survey is the primary indicator of an appropriate speed zone which might be imposed subject to the secondary factors of crash experience, traffic volumes, road features or other special situation.

The pace is the 10 mph increment of observed speeds which contains the greatest number of vehicles. In all cases in this survey, the 85th percentile speed and the recommended speed limit generally lies somewhere within the pace limits, close to the 85th percentile speed. The percent of vehicles in the pace speed is an indication of the bunching of vehicular speeds. Ideally, if all vehicles would be traveling at or about the same speed, there would be reduced likelihood of traffic collisions. In speed limit analysis, the higher the percent of vehicles within the pace speeds, the better the speed distribution. The percent in the pace often runs between 60 and 80.

Driving the Streets

A final field check was made by an Engineer from the Engineering Office, driving each street surveyed, “floating” with prevailing traffic to determine the speed of traffic which is reasonable from the driver’s viewpoint. The Engineer was aware of the previously described data analysis and was particularly cognizant of the 85th percentile speed and the pace speeds. The Engineer evaluated the appropriateness of the 85th percentile and added the perspective of human judgment to the speed limit setting process. Such factors as roadside development, driveways, parked vehicles, emergency shoulder areas, schools and playgrounds, areas frequented by pedestrians, horizontal and vertical alignment of the roadway, intersection visibility and control, and numerous other less tangible factors are considered and included in the judgment producing a final recommended limit.

Speed Limit Recommendation Philosophy

With all of the dry statistics inherent in the speed survey process, there is, to a certain extent, a philosophy implied during the establishment of speed limits. Speed limits should be reasonable and realistic regardless of what the numbers indicate. Reasonable speed limits are ones at which the average prudent driver would drive without enforcement and without any signing. One cannot rely totally on this philosophy, however, as motorists tend to drive somewhat faster in residential districts away from their home than residents on the streets would prefer. In other words, motorists tend to be more concerned about speeds near their own homes and less concerned elsewhere. This is not so much a tendency to willfully break the law or to drive unsafe, but rather a reflection of human nature, a greater concern for safety near home, the press of time, and the use of high performance vehicles. For this reason, speed limits on two-lane local residential streets tend to be somewhat further removed from the critical 85th percentile speed than those on the multi-lane arterial and collector streets without residential frontages.

Another factor in establishing reasonable speed limits, is to avoid frequent changes in the speed limit on a single street or relatively short lengths of a specific numerical limit. Speed limits which change every half mile or so may more accurately reflect prevailing driving conditions on the roadway, but do not give motorists a fair chance at becoming totally aware of their lawful limit. For this reason, some speeds recommended in this report are set with the idea of consistency of limits.

Due to its coastal location and unique atmosphere conditions, dense fog conditions occur in Daly City on most days throughout the year, severely affecting visibility. High residential density generates significant pedestrian traffic and increased interferences to

through traffic from parking, driveways and other factors. Speeds higher than 35 mph are generally not considered safe on Daly City streets due to the aforementioned conditions.

Chapter 3: Recommended Speed Limits

A summary of the streets surveyed and recommended speed limits are shown in Table 1 in this chapter.

The recommendations are based on the following:

1. Prima-facie speed limits of 25 mph are recommended for the street segments in the residential and business districts and school zones and is 15 mph for alleyways.
2. Speed limits greater than prima-facie limits are recommended at the nearest five-mile hour increment of the 85th-percentile speed. Per CA MUTCD, the posted speed limit may be reduced by 5 mph from the nearest 5 mph, in compliance with CVC Section 627 and 22358.5. For cases in which the nearest 5 mph increment of the 85th-percentile speed would require rounding up, then the posted speed limit may be rounded down to the nearest 5 mph increment below the 85th percentile speed, if no further reduction is used. If the speed limit to be posted has had the 5 mph reduction applied, then an Engineering and Traffic Survey (E&TS) shall document in writing the conditions and justification for the lower speed limit.

Based on the procedures of the CA MUTCD (2020) and recent speed surveys, the following recommended speed limits at the following locations are below the 85th percentile “critical” speed based on other factors and information than speed survey:

1. **Callan Boulevard**, from Morton Drive to King Drive

- Existing posted speed limit: 30 mph
- Critical speed: 36 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 30 mph**

Justification:

- Fog. Dense fog in the area limits visibility.
- Consistency. The posted speed limit on Callan Boulevard, between Hickey Boulevard and Morton Drive, is 35 mph.

2. **Crocker Street**, from Templeton Avenue to Rampart Way

- Existing posted speed limit: 25 mph
- Critical speed: 31 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justification:

- Residential Density. Residential houses front the north side of Crocker Street between Templeton Avenue and the area just east of Point Pacific Drive.

3. **E. Market Street**, from Mission Street to Hillside Boulevard

- Existing posted speed limit: 25 mph
- Critical speed: 30 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justification:

- Consistency. East of this segment, the speed limit on E. Market Street, from Hillside Boulevard to the City Limit, is posted at 25 mph.

4. **Hillside Boulevard**, from E. Market Street to City Limits

- Existing posted speed limit: 25 mph
- Critical speed: 30 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justification:

- Consistency. South of this segment, the speed limit on Hillside Boulevard, from Valley Street to Hoffman Street, is posted at 25 mph.

5. **John Daly Boulevard**, from Skyline Boulevard to Lake Merced Boulevard

- Existing posted speed limit: 35 mph
- Critical speed: 40 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 35 mph**

Justifications:

- Fog. Dense fog in the area limits visibility.
- Consistency. East of this segment, the speed limit on John Daly Boulevard, which has a high crash rate, is posted at 35 mph.

6. **King Drive**, from Verducci Drive to City Limit

- Existing posted speed limit: 30 mph
- Critical speed: 36 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 30 mph**

Justifications:

- Consistency. West of this segment, the speed limit on King Drive, from Verducci Drive to the City Limit, is posted at 30 mph.
- Fog. Dense fog in the area limits visibility.

7. **Skyline Drive**, from Oceanside Drive to Westridge Avenue

- Existing posted speed limit: 25 mph
- Critical speed: 32 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justification:

- Fog. Dense fog in the area routinely limits visibility.

8. **Southgate Avenue**, from Elmwood Drive to Westmoor Avenue

- Existing posted speed limit: 25 mph
- Critical speed: 32 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justifications:

- Consistency. South of this segment, the speed limit on Southgate Avenue, from Westmoor Avenue to St. Francis Boulevard, is posted at 25 mph.
- Fog. Dense fog in the area limits visibility.
- School. Southgate Avenue provides direct access to Tobias Elementary School.

9. **South Hill Boulevard**, from Crocker Avenue to City Limits

- Existing posted speed limit: 25 mph
- Critical speed: 32 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justification:

- Residential Density. Residential houses front the north side of South Hill Boulevard between Crocker Avenue and the City Limits.

10. **St. Francis Boulevard**, from Southgate Avenue to Serramonte Boulevard

- Existing posted speed limit: 30 mph
- Critical speed: 31 mph
- **Recommend speed limit: 25 mph**

Justification:

- Consistency. North of this segment, the speed limit on St. Francis Boulevard, from Eastmoor Avenue to Southgate Avenue, will be posted at 25 mph.
- Residential Density. Residential houses front both sides of St. Francis Boulevard between Southgate Avenue to Serramonte Boulevard.

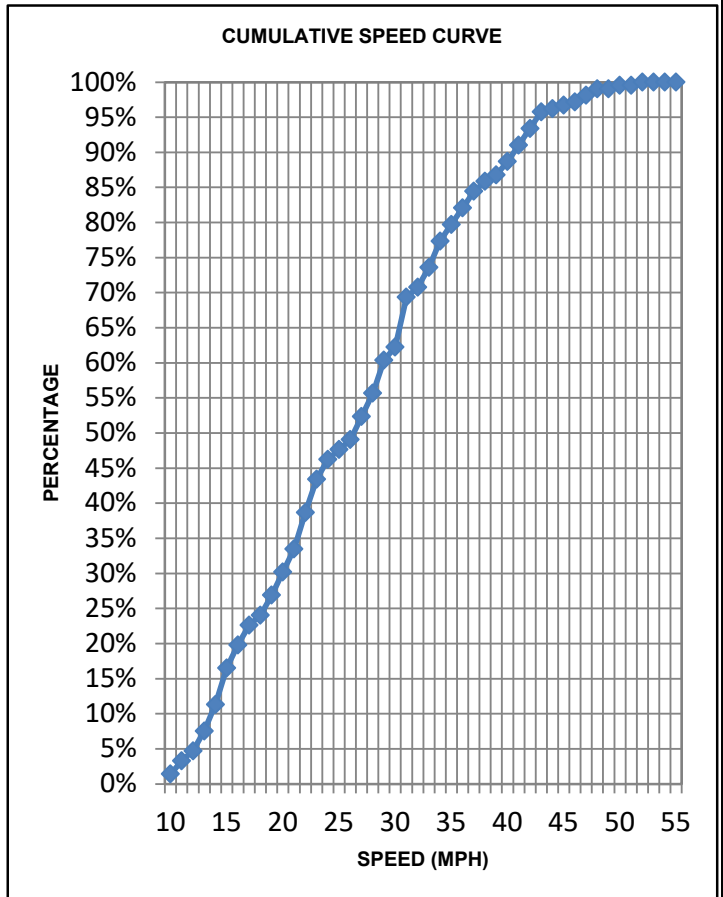
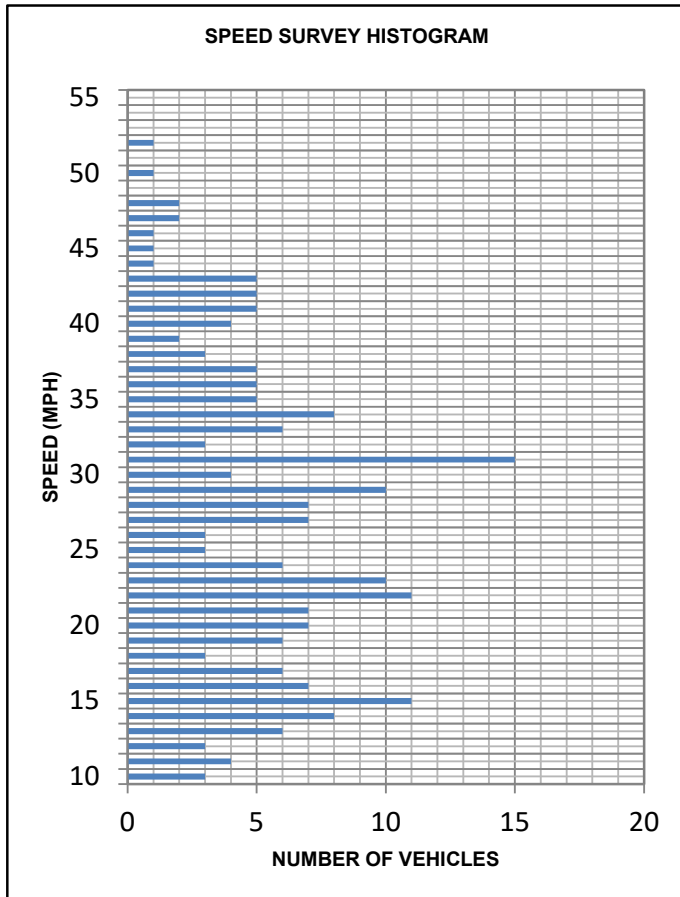

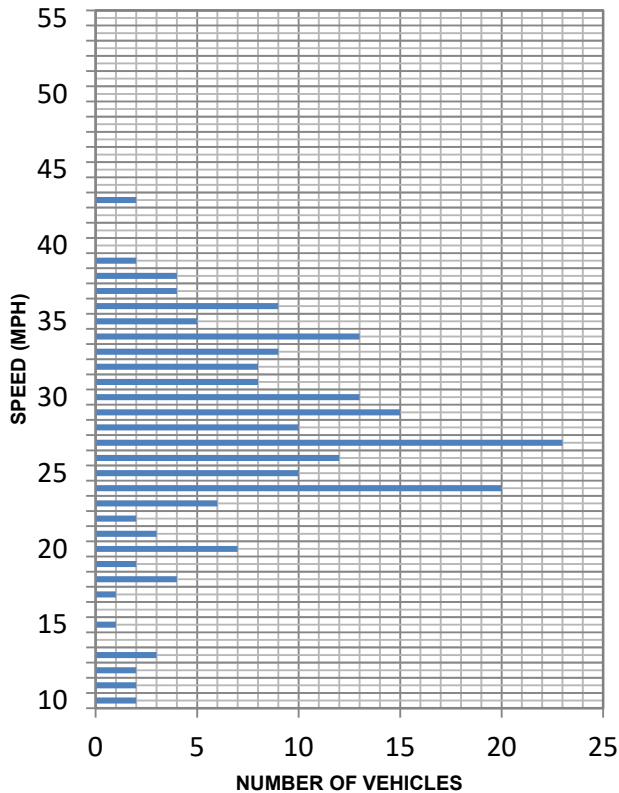

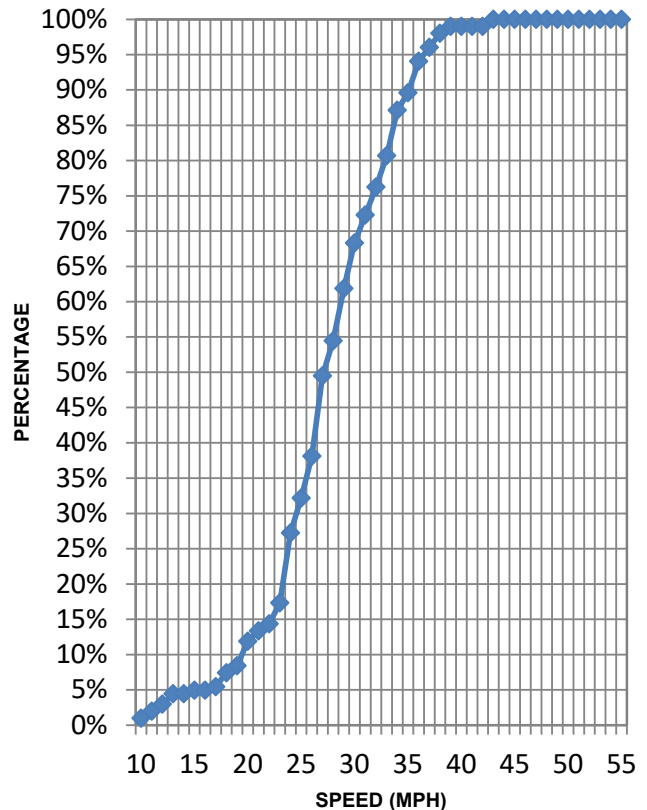

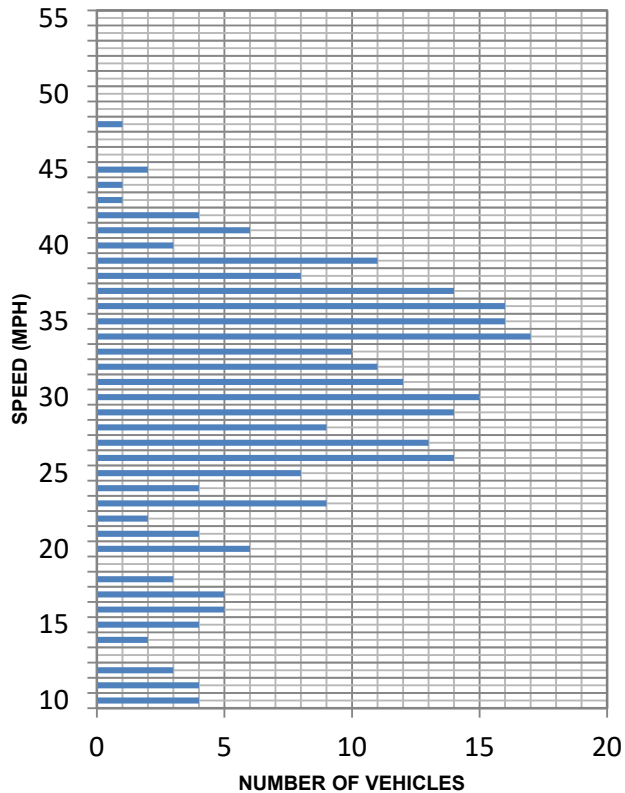

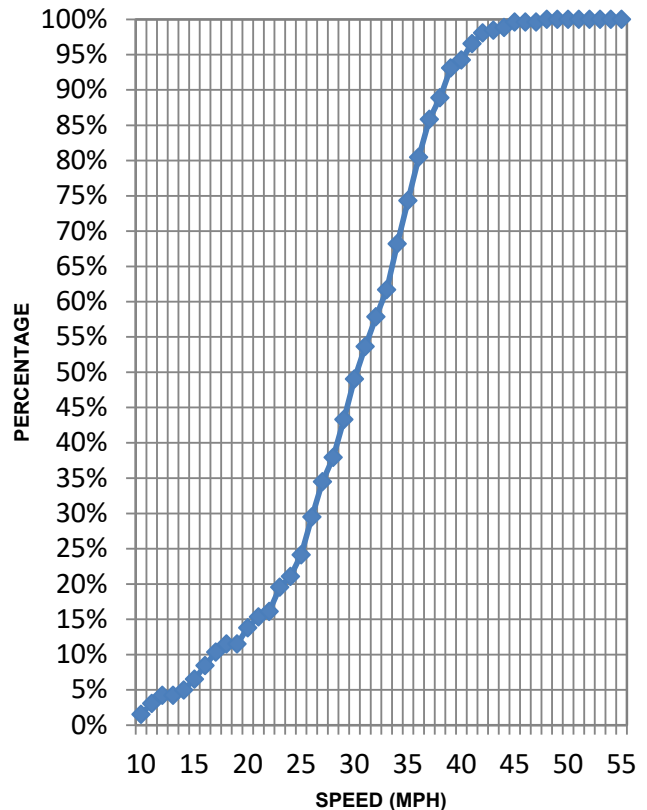

Section 2: Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council of the City of Daly City declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, clauses, phrases or portions be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 3: The City Council finds, pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 15378, that this Ordinance is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) in that it is not a project as provided by the Act, in that it does not have a potential for resulting in a detrimental physical change in the environment, directly or ultimately, as provided in Title 14, Section 15378(a), and that it is also exempt under the definition of "project" in Section 15378(b)(3) in that it concern general policy and procedure making.

Section 4: Publication/Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced thirty (30) days from and after its adoption. The City Clerk shall publish this ordinance according to law.

Recommended Action

Conduct a public hearing for City Council consideration to adopt an Urgency Ordinance to require large grocery stores to provide hazard pay to their employees.

Background

The City Council expressed interest in the concept of requiring large grocery stores to pay hazard pay to their employees. The City Council directed staff to prepare an Urgency Ordinance for review and consideration.

Under Labor Code section 1205 vests cities and counties with the authority to set labor standards regarding the payment of wages that are more stringent than state standards

Discussion

The ordinance has been drafted to set the amount of hazard pay at \$5 per hour requirements. The ordinance provides for a credit against the amount of hazard pay that the employers are voluntarily paying at the time the ordinance goes into effect.

The ordinance applies to grocery stores that are at least 12,000 square feet in size located within the geographic limits of the City and that employ 500 or more employees nationwide. The ordinance defines grocery store, as a retail store of any kind located within the geographic limits of the City that devotes 70% or more of its interior space to the sale of food products.

The ordinance would require the payment of hazard pay to all covered employees, defined as any person who, in a calendar week, performs at least two (2) hours of work for a Covered Employer within the geographic boundaries of the City, is paid by the hour, and qualifies as an employee entitled to payment of a minimum wage from any Covered Employer under the California minimum wage law. The ordinance would not require the payment of hazard pay to managers, supervisors, or confidential employees.

The ordinance has been drafted to expire 120 days after its effective date. It is anticipated that this will provide enough time for the covered employees to be vaccinated.

The ordinance includes a requirement that employers provide notice to their employees of the protections afforded by the ordinance and the provision of a private right of action authorizing employees to bring their own actions to enforce the ordinance.

An urgency ordinance must be passed by a four-fifths vote of the City Council and this ordinance as drafted will become effective 10 days after adoption. This will allow sufficient notice to grocery stores to comply with the ordinance. In addition, staff sent out courtesy notice of the proposed ordinance to all grocery stores that will be subject to the hazard pay requirements. Findings for the urgency need to be made for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, and such findings are incorporated in the ordinance.

Summary/Conclusion

The City Council consider by a four-fifths vote, adoption of the attached Urgency Ordinance to require large grocery stores within the City to provide hazard pay to their employees.

Staff is available to provide any additional information desired by the Mayor or Councilmembers.

AN URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALY CITY
ADDING CHAPTER 5.106 TO THE DALY CITY MUNICIPAL CODE TO REQUIRE
GROCERY STORES IN CITY OF DALY CITY TO PAY EMPLOYEES HAZARD PAY
DURING THE NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) PANDEMIC

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALY CITY DOES
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, international, national, state, and local health and governmental authorities are responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus named "SARS-CoV-2," and the disease it causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019," abbreviated COVID-19, ("COVID-19"); and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the California State Public Health Officer, designated specific sectors and their workers, including grocery stores, as Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers ("essential workers") to ensure the "continuity of functions critical to public health and safety, as well as economic and national security;" and

WHEREAS, according to a November 2020 study by the *Brookings Institution, Windfall Profits and Deadly Risks*, the United States' top retail grocery companies have earned record levels of profits during the pandemic, and this increase in profit has not been reflected in higher earnings for grocery workers, who have borne the hazardous work condition that underpin those record profits; and

WHEREAS, the City of Day City recognizes that essential grocery store workers must be justly compensated for the clear and present dangers of doing their jobs during the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, it is a well-established practice to afford grocery workers supplemental compensation for performing hazardous duty or work involving physical hardship that can cause extreme discomfort and distress; and

WHEREAS, grocery store workers are performing hazardous duty due to the significant risk of exposure to COVID-19; they have been working under these hazardous conditions for months, and they will continue to do so for the foreseeable future as the COVID-19 emergency presents an ongoing threat for an uncertain period, with the potential for subsequent waves of infection; and

WHEREAS, essential grocery workers cannot choose to work from home--they must come to work to do their jobs, which involve heightened risk of exposure and infection of COVID-19 through substantial interaction with customers on an ongoing basis and indoors where there is less air circulation; and

WHEREAS, United Food and Commercial Workers ("UFCW") Locals in Northern California, which represent grocery workers, report that over 700 grocery workers in their ranks have tested positive with COVID-19, and members of their union have been hospitalized or have died from the coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, there are numerous large grocery chains operating in Daly City that employ workers in Daly City and have at least 500 employees nationwide, with workers who are facing the hazards of COVID-19 in the workplace every day; and

WHEREAS, the continued availability of grocery stores to the public and the ability of their employees to continue working, notwithstanding hazardous conditions, is fundamental to the health and welfare of the community, and establishing hazard pay for grocery store workers protects public health and welfare by insuring the stability of the food supply chain, supports stable incomes and promotes job retention and retention of employees by stores, by ensuring that grocery and workers are compensated for the substantial risks they are undertaking to provide essential services in a safe and uninterrupted manner during the COVID-19 emergency; and

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2021, the California Department of Public Health reported another COVID-19 variant that had grown more common across the state since December, with worrisome signs that this variant may be highly transmissible; and

WHEREAS, a growing list of cities and counties across California, including City of San Mateo, County of San Mateo, South San Francisco, City Daly City , Berkeley, Los Angeles, Long Beach, San Jose, and San Leandro began announcing and adopting legislation for hazard pay for grocery workers during the period where counties are in the Purple, Red, or Orange level of Community Transmission for COVID-19 under State Health orders; and

WHEREAS, the California Constitution, Article XI, Section 7, vests cities and counties with the authority to enact ordinances to protect the health, safety, and general welfare, of their citizens; and

WHEREAS, Labor Code section 1205 vests cities and counties with the authority to set labor standards regarding the payment of wages that are more stringent than state standards: and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALY CITY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Recitals. The City Council finds the foregoing recitals to be true and correct and hereby incorporates those recitals into this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. Emergency Need. The City Council finds and declares that adoption of this Urgency Ordinance (“Ordinance”) is necessary for preserving the public peace, health, and safety for the following reasons:

- A. The COVID-19 pandemic has led to the current state of emergency in California.
- B. Grocery stores are the primary points of distribution for food and other daily necessities for the residents of the City of Daly City and are therefore essential to the vitality of our community.
- C. To protect the food supply chain and the public health and safety, the City of Daly City must take steps to guard against turnover and ensure that grocery stores in Daly City have well-trained, consistent, and stable staffing.

SECTION 3. Effective Dates. This Ordinance will expire one hundred twenty (120) days after the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Short title. This Ordinance shall constitute the “Hazard Pay for Grocery Workers Ordinance” and may be cited as such.

SECTION 5. Definitions. The definitions set forth in this Section shall govern the construction and meaning of the terms used in this Ordinance:

- A. "Base Wage" means the hourly wage paid to Covered Employees as of the effective date of this Ordinance less Hazard Pay owed under this Ordinance or any other premium hourly rate already paid to compensate Covered Employees for working during the pandemic (referred to herein as "Employer-Initiated Hazard Pay").
- B. "City" means the City of Daly City.
- C. "Covered Employer" means any Person who (a) directly or indirectly or through an agent or any other Person owns or operates a Grocery Store and employs or exercises control over the wages, hours or working conditions of any Covered Employee; and (b) employs 500 or more employees nationwide regardless of where those employees are employed, or is a Franchisee associated with a Franchisor or a network of Franchises with Franchisees that employ more than 500 employees in the aggregate, regardless of where those employees are employed.
- D. "Covered Employee" means any person who, in a calendar week, performs at least two (2) hours of work for a Covered Employer within the geographic boundaries of the City, is paid by the hour, and qualifies as an employee entitled to payment of a minimum wage from any Covered Employer under the California minimum wage law, as provided under Section 1197 of the California Labor Code and wage orders published by the California Industrial Welfare Commission.
- E. "Covered Employee" does not include managers, supervisors, or confidential employees.
- F. "Employer-Initiated Hazard Pay" means any other premium hourly rate already paid by a Covered Employer solely to compensate Covered Employees for working during the pandemic.
- G. "Franchise" means a written agreement by which:
 - a. A Person is granted the right to engage in the business of offering, selling, or distributing goods or services under a marketing plan prescribed or suggested in substantial part by the grantor or its affiliates; and
 - b. The operation of the business is substantially associated with a trademark, service mark, tradename, advertising, or other commercial symbol; designating, owned by, or licensed by the grantor or its affiliate; and
 - c. The Person pays, agrees to pay, or is required to pay, directly or indirectly, a Franchise fee.
- H. "Franchisee" means a Person to whom a Franchise is offered or granted.
- I. "Franchisor" means a Person who grants a franchise to another Person.
- J. "Grocery Store" means a retail or wholesale store that is at least 12,000 square feet in size that is located within the geographic limits of the City, and that sells primarily

household foodstuffs for offsite consumption, including the sale of fresh produce, meats, poultry, fish, deli products, dairy products, canned foods, dry foods, beverages, baked foods, or prepared foods. Other household supplies or other products shall be secondary to the primary purpose of food sales. For the purposes of this Ordinance, “Grocery Store” also means a retail store of any kind located within the geographic limits of the City that devotes 70% or more of its interior space to the sale of household foodstuffs for offsite consumption, including the sale of fresh produce, meats, poultry, fish, deli products, dairy products, canned foods, dry foods, beverages, baked foods, or prepared foods.

- K. “Hazard Pay” means an additional \$5.00 per hour wage bonus in addition to each Covered Employee’s Base Wage or Holiday Premium wage for each hour worked within the City.
- L. “Holiday Premium” means the hourly wage paid to Covered Employees for performing work during a holiday or holiday season.
- M. “Hours Worked” means the time during which a Covered Employee is subject to the control of a Covered Employer, including all the time the employee is suffered or permitted to work, and on-call.
- N. “Person” means any individual, corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited liability partnership, limited liability company, business trust, estate, trust, association, joint venture, agency, instrumentality, or any other legal or commercial entity, whether domestic or foreign.
- O. “Retaliatory Action” shall mean the failure to hire, or the discharge, suspension, demotion, penalization, lowering of the Base Wage or Holiday Premium wage, or discrimination or any other adverse action against a Covered Employee with respect to the terms and conditions of the Covered Employee’s employment, for opposing any practice proscribed by this Ordinance, for participating in proceedings related to this Ordinance, for seeking to enforce his or her rights under this Ordinance by any lawful means, or for otherwise asserting rights under this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. Payment of Hazard Pay to Covered Employees.

- A. Hazard Pay. Covered Employers shall pay Covered Employees a wage of no less than the hourly rate set under the authority of this Ordinance. The Hazard Pay hourly rate for each Covered Employee shall be an additional five dollars (\$5.00) per hour for all hours worked at a Grocery Store or, in addition to the Covered Employee’s Base Wage or Holiday Premium, whichever applicable at the time of hours worked. The Hazard Pay rate shall not include compensation already owed to Covered Employees, Holiday Premium rates, gratuities, service charge distributions, or other bonuses.
- B. Duration of Hazard Pay. Covered Employers shall pay Hazard Pay to all workers for any and all work performed during the effective period of this Ordinance, not to exceed 120-days from the effective date of the Ordinance.
- C. Credit for Employer-Initiated Hazard Pay. Credits. Covered Employers providing employer-initiated hazard pay will be credited for doing so in accordance with Section 4. Hazard Pay otherwise required under this Ordinance shall be reduced by the hourly amount of any Employer-Initiated Hazard Pay (e.g. A Covered Employer offering a two

dollar (\$2.00) per hour Employer-Initiated Hazard Pay pays an additional three dollar (\$3.00) per hour in Hazard Pay pursuant to this Ordinance.) Such Covered Employer must demonstrate that, for work performed during the effective period of this Ordinance, all Covered Employees are receiving such Employer-Initiated Hazard Pay. No Covered Employer shall be credited for any past payments of Employer- Initiated Hazard Pay. No Covered Employer shall be credited for any hourly premiums already owed to Covered Employees, such as but not limited to, Holiday Premiums. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to prohibit any Covered Employer from paying more than five dollars (\$5.00) per hour in Hazard Pay.

SECTION 7. Waiver. The provisions of this ordinance may not be waived by agreement between an individual Covered Employee and a Covered Employer. All the provisions of this ordinance, or any part thereof, may be waived in a bona fide collective bargaining agreement, but only if the waiver is explicitly set forth in such agreement in clear and unambiguous terms.

SECTION 8. Prohibitions.

- A. No Covered Employer or any other Person shall interfere with, restrain, or deny the existence of, or the attempt to exercise, any rights protected under this Ordinance.
- B. No Covered Employer or any other Person shall take any Retaliatory Action against any Covered Employee exercising the Covered Employee's rights under this Ordinance. Rights protected under this Ordinance include but are not limited to: the right to file a complaint or inform any Person or government agency about any party's alleged noncompliance with this Ordinance; and the right to inform any Person of the Person's potential rights under this Ordinance and to assist the Person in asserting such rights. Protections of this Ordinance shall apply to any Covered Employee who mistakenly, but in good faith, alleges noncompliance with this Ordinance.
- C. Taking adverse action against an employee, including lowering an employee's Base Wage or Holiday Premium Wages or reducing work hours, within 90 days of the employee's exercise of rights protected under this ordinance shall raise a rebuttable presumption of having done so in retaliation for the exercise of such rights.

SECTION 9. Notice and Posting.

- A. Hiring entities shall provide covered designated workers with a written notice of rights established by this Ordinance. The notice of rights shall be in a form and manner sufficient to inform designated workers of their rights under this Ordinance. The notice of rights shall provide information on: The right to premium pay guaranteed by this Ordinance.
- B. The right to be protected from retaliation for exercising in good faith the rights protected by this Ordinance; and
- C. The right to bring a civil action for a violation of the requirements of this Ordinance, including a hiring entity's denial of premium pay as required by this Ordinance and a hiring entity or other person's retaliation against a covered designated worker or other person for asserting the right to premium pay or otherwise engaging in an activity protected by this Ordinance

SECTION 10. Enforcement.

- A. Any person aggrieved by a violation of this Ordinance, on or after the effective date of this Ordinance, may bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction against the Covered Employer or other person violating this Ordinance and, upon prevailing, shall be awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and costs and shall be entitled to such legal or equitable relief as may be appropriate to remedy the violation including, without limitation, the payment of any Hazard Premium Pay unlawfully withheld.
- B. The remedies, penalties and procedures provided under this Ordinance are not exhaustive and are not intended to be exclusive of any other available remedies, penalties and procedures.

SECTION 11. Prohibitions.

- A. No Covered Employer or any other Person shall interfere with, restrain, or deny the existence of, or the attempt to exercise, any rights protected under this Ordinance.
- B. No Covered Employer or any other Person shall take any Retaliatory Action against any Covered Employee exercising the Covered Employee's rights under this Ordinance. Rights protected under this Ordinance include but are not limited to: the right to file a complaint or inform any Person or government agency about any party's alleged noncompliance with this Ordinance; and the right to inform any Person of the Person's potential rights under this Ordinance and to assist the Person in asserting such rights. Protections of this Ordinance shall apply to any Covered Employee who mistakenly, but in good faith, alleges noncompliance with this Ordinance.
- C. Taking adverse action against a Covered Employee, including but not limited to lowering a Covered Employee's Base Wage or Holiday Premium Wages or reduction of hours, within ninety (90) days of the Covered Employee's exercise of rights protected under this Ordinance shall raise a rebuttable presumption of having done so in retaliation for the exercise of such rights.

SECTION 12. Notice and Posting. Every Covered Employer shall post in a conspicuous place at any workplace or job site where any Covered Employee works, a notice informing Covered Employees of their rights under this Ordinance. Every Covered Employer also shall provide each Covered Employee at the time this Ordinance becomes effective or at the time of hire, whichever is later, the Covered Employer and owner or manager's name; address; telephone number; and whether it is part of a chain, integrated enterprise, or Franchise associated with a franchisor or network of franchises. If the information the Covered Employer provided to the Covered Employee changes, the Covered Employer shall provide the updated information in writing within ten (10) days of the change.

SECTION 13. No Mandatory Duty. Nothing in this Ordinance is intended to create a mandatory duty on the part of the County, County employees, any Cities or City employees, to protect persons or property from a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance. This Ordinance is not intended to, and does not, create any rights or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or equity, against the City.

SECTION 14. Effective Date. This Urgency Ordinance is hereby declared to be an urgency Ordinance and is adopted under the provisions of the Government Code of the State of California, Section 36937, and shall be effective 10 days after its adoption. This ordinance shall automatically expire and no longer be of any effect 120 days after its effective date.

SECTION 15. Urgency Findings. Pursuant to California Government Code Section 36937, this Ordinance is designed to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Daly City and shall be effective within 10 days upon adoption of the City Council. The City Council hereby finds that there is an urgent need to adopt these regulations in order to address the current and immediate threats set forth above.

SECTION 16. CEQA. The City Council determines that the adoption of this Urgency Ordinance is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) pursuant to the following provisions of the CEQA Guidelines, 14 California Code of Regulations, Chapter 3: this Urgency Ordinance is exempt under CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(5) in that it is not a “project” under CEQA, and will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.

SECTION 17. Severability. If any section or provision of this Urgency Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, or contravened by reason of any preemptive legislation, the remaining sections and/or provisions of this Urgency Ordinance shall remain valid. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Urgency Ordinance, and each section or provision thereof, regardless of the fact that any one or more section(s) or provision(s) may be declared invalid or unconstitutional or contravened via legislation.

SECTION 18. Publication. The Mayor shall sign this ordinance and the City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption of it, and within fifteen (15) days, publish once in a newspaper of general circulation circulated within the City of Daly City. The City Clerk shall post at City Hall a copy of the full text of this Ordinance in accordance with Government Code Section 65858 and 75090 and posted on the City’s website

Subject: Requesting Use of State Asset Forfeiture Funds to Purchase Patrol Car Computers and Communication Headsets for the Police Department

Recommended Action

Staff recommends Council approve the use of State Asset Forfeiture funds to purchase (23) patrol car computers and (25) police radio headsets.

Background

The Police Department recently implemented Versaterm, a new multimillion-dollar Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) software for use in patrol cars, which was acquired through our dispatch services provider, Public Safety Communications, using Measure A funds. This CAD software requires a substantial amount of computing performance to run optimally for officer safety and efficiency. Current computer hardware is either outdated or incapable of maximizing the software, requiring the purchase of (23) Getac laptops for the patrol car fleet. Additionally, the police department needs to replace (25) police radio headsets for existing headsets assigned to specialized units that are beyond end of life and repair support.

Discussion

In January 2021, the Department implemented the Versaterm CAD software for use by officers in the field. This multidisciplinary CAD software improves efficiency, safety, and resource accountability and allocation due to its map centric (GPS) capabilities, including GPS navigation. The computing demands for the software are substantial, and therefore require modern hardware to perform. Some existing in-car computers have met basic needs, but not all can run the software, or have had reliability issues. Getac laptops were selected after researching and testing other industry frontrunners with our current software. Getac laptops meet our needs and provide sufficient computing performance to reliably run the new CAD and expand as needed. The laptops will provide portability, something our current systems do not provide, allowing officers to increase efficiency with in-field reporting.

The requested (25) police radio headsets are replacements for current headsets, which are breaking and no longer supported for repair. These headsets are assigned to specialty units and provide enhanced communications abilities as well as advanced hearing protection. The police department evaluated several headsets and the Invisio model met department needs for functionality and overall hearing protection.

Fiscal Impact

Funding is available using State Asset Forfeiture Funds. The one-time purchase cost for the (23) Getac patrol car computers and supporting installation hardware will not exceed \$115,000, and the one-time purchase cost for the Invisio headsets will not exceed \$30,000.

Subject: Fire / Paramedic Engine Company Restoration (Engine 95) for North County Fire Authority

Recommended Action

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the requested funding allocation to North County Fire Authority (NCFA) for service restoration and authorize the City Manager to begin restoration of one fire engine company, Engine 95.

Background

Budgetary impacts from the Great Recession have been long lasting in Daly City and have resulted in the reduction of services across City departments. To address a structural budget deficit and minimize the use of General Fund Reserves to fill an ongoing fiscal gap, the City Council approved a biennial budget for FY 2017-2018 and FY 2018-2019 that for the first time included significant reductions in public safety services. This biennial budget eliminated one NCFA engine company (Engine 95) through attrition of the nine associated NCFA personnel.

Subsequently and in an effort to preserve public safety services, the City Council placed Measure V – the Public Safety Parcel Tax – on the ballot in November 2016. Measure V was designed to restore 10 specific police and fire personnel and related operational costs. Measure V failed to gain the two-thirds majority vote needed for approval.

Discussion

The City Council placed Measure Q – The Daly City Local Recovery & Relief Measure – on the ballot in November 2020. Voters considered the following Measure Q ballot question:

“To provide emergency funding that cannot be taken by the State-maintaining the City's long-term financial stability/City services, such as supporting local businesses; preventing/addressing homelessness; maintaining paramedic, fire and 911 emergency response, senior services; preparing for natural disaster and public health emergencies, shall the measure establishing a ½¢ sales tax, providing approximately \$6,000,000 until ended by voters and requiring independent audits and public oversight, be adopted.”

Measure Q was overwhelmingly approved by voters; more than 72% voted in favor of the half-cent sales tax measure. The tax measure will go into effect in Daly City in April 2021. Receipts from the tax measure will be received by the City in June 2021.

Measure Q specifically referenced emergency response services as well as preparing for natural disasters and public health emergencies. Additionally, community surveying in 2020 revealed a strong level of support for emergency response services. The following list of spending priorities related to emergency response and NCFA include the percentage of respondents that rated each service as extremely or very important:

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- Maintaining emergency life-saving equipment and apparatus – 89%
- Maintaining local fire protection – 89%
- Maintaining local paramedic services – 88%
- Maintaining local paramedic staffing and capacity – 88%
- Maintaining 911 emergency response – 87%
- Natural disaster and emergency response – 85%
- Preparing for future natural disasters or medical emergencies – 84%

The City also conducted a follow up survey in 2020 – *The Daly City Discussion* – to further refine and prioritize community spending priorities. Out of seven priorities included in the survey, the following relate to NCFA operations:

- Preparing for any future medical or catastrophic emergency - #3 rank of 7
- Restoring and improving local fire protection and emergency medical response - #5 of 7
- Maintaining local paramedic staffing and capacity - #7 of 7

A portion of Measure Q funds could be used to fund the restoration of Engine 95 and nine associated staff. This potential funding allocation is closely aligned with community priorities and broad support for emergency response services. The restoration of this fire engine company will provide community benefits by serving as an additional paramedic and firefighting first response capable unit.

Fiscal Impact

The estimated General Fund impact to restore Engine 95 is \$2,866,703 for FY 2021-22. This amount will be included in the FY 2021-22 budget request.

Summary/Conclusion

Due to the success of Measure Q, the City Council now has an opportunity to restore Engine 95, three and a half years after its elimination. The Daly City community broadly supports emergency response services, and NCFA-related services are rated as extremely or very important to the majority of respondents to community surveys.

Daly City's recovery from the pandemic is a principal concern among both staff and community members. Restoring Engine 95 would expand emergency services at a critical time in our local recovery.

Update on CDBG-CV 3 Allocation

This memo provides background information on the following items that will be discussed at our March 2, 2021 meeting:

- A. Allocation of Daly City's FY 21-22 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds
- B. Allocation of Daly City's FY 21-22 HOME funds
- C. Update on Allocation of CDBG-CV 3 Funds

A. ALLOCATION OF FY 21-22 CDBG FUNDS

1. **Resources** – Although HUD indicated earlier that cities would be advised of their 2021-22 CDBG and HOME allocations by the end of February, as of February 26, we have not received notification. For planning purposes and to fulfill our obligation to adopt a spending plan for 2021-22 by April 2021, we have assumed an allocation of CDBG funds of \$1,074,661, an amount equivalent to what we received for the current fiscal year. Combined with anticipated program income, we estimate the City will have a total of \$1,615,662 for CDBG activities in 2021-22. Table 1 summarizes our total estimated CDBG revenue for 2021-22. Please be advised, this number could change when HUD provides formal notification of FY 21-22 funding allocations.
2. **Funding Requests** - Since 2013, and in recognition of shrinking CDBG funds allocated to Daly City, reductions in City staff who administer the CDBG program and the increasing regulatory burden imposed by HUD for administration of CDBG public service contracts, the City implemented a two-year funding cycle for CDBG subrecipients. Under this arrangement, organizations that are awarded CDBG funds in

Daly City, are offered a two-year contract that is automatically reviewed in the second year, provided the organization is meeting contractual objectives. FY 21-22 will be year two of a two-year funding cycle. Therefore, a request for proposals was not circulated for FY 21-22 and staff recommends renewing all of the subrecipient contracts funded in FY 20-21.

In February, ECD met with Public Work staff to discuss capital projects that might qualify for CDBG funding. In this discussion, Public Works staff described the need for sidewalk curb ramps in several neighborhoods and in conjunction with street resurfacing activity. The estimated cost for the most critically needed ramps described by Public Works staff is \$400,000. (See attachment 2). ADA modifications such as wheelchair ramps are an eligible capital project expense under the CDBG regulations.

3. Recommended Allocations –

For our meeting on March 2, we have prepared preliminary recommendations for how the City might allocate 2021-22 CDBG funds. These recommendations are shown in Table 3 and envision funding Administration, Housing Rehabilitation and public service subrecipients at their current year levels. The recommendation also includes an allocation of \$400,000 for sidewalk wheelchair ramps to be carried out by the Department of Public Works.

B. ALLOCATION OF FY 2021-22 HOME FUNDS

As with CDBG funds, there is no adopted Federal Budget for 2021-22 or any notification from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regarding the likely allocation of 2021-22 HOME funds to Daly City. Assuming an allocation similar to that received in FY2020-21, Staff estimates HOME funds for 2021-22 will be approximately \$380,743. Combined with prior year funds allocated for affordable housing development (\$544,626), we might have a total of \$887,294 in HOME funds available for affordable housing activities in 2021-22.

Staff recommends that ten percent (the statutory limit) of the allocation be set aside for HOME program administrations.

Staff is currently in discussion with several affordable housing developers regarding proposed HOME-eligible rental housing projects in Daly City, including Midway Village, 493 Eastmoor and Bridge Housing's proposed project located at Carter and Martin. It is recommended that the balance of available HOME funds (approximately \$887,294) be allocated for the purpose of affordable rental housing development. When actual project proposals are complete, staff will present specific project details and funding details to Council for consideration.

C. UPDATE TO CDBG-CV 3 ALLOCATION PLANS

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES) was enacted by Congress on March 27, 2020 and provided an estimated \$2 trillion stimulus package to battle the harmful

effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Act provided a total of \$5 billion in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

These CDBG funds can be used for any CDBG eligible activity to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus (COVID-19). These funds are referred to in this memo as “CDBG-CV” to differentiate them from the regular annual allocation of CDBG funds that Daly City receives. Tranche 1 CDBG-CV funds provided an allocation of \$632,285 for Daly City. On June 8, 2020 Council approved an amendment to the 2019-20 HUD Action Plan, formally allocating these funds to emergency rental assistance and associated administrative and program delivery costs.

On September 15, 2020, the City was notified of an allocation of additional CDBG-CV funds totaling \$1,044,763. These are referred to CDBG-CV3 funds. Allocation of these funds to a particular activity will be memorialized as an amendment to the 2019-20 HUD Action Plan. The CARES Act requires that. 80% of funds to be expended within three years of grant agreement. 100% to be expended within six years of grant agreement

A total of 20 percent (\$208,952) of the CDBG-CV3 funds can be used for program administration and might cover costs for staff needed to carry out funded activities and comply with all HUD requirements related to planning, administration and reporting of CDBG expenditures. Since the beginning of March 2020, staff have already devoted hundreds of hours addressing housing issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The cost of this time, as well as any additional time spent administering activities funded with CDBG-CV3 are eligible administrative costs under the CDBG-CV program.

Since notification of Daly City’s CDBG-CV 3 funds staff has continued to evaluate housing and community development needs that could be addressed with an allocation of CDBG funds. Currently, staff has identified significant ongoing need for additional emergency rental assistance, financial assistance to small businesses and potentially, assistance to providers of emergency food.

On January 14, 2021, President Biden introduced the Rescue America Plan to Congress. This \$1.9 trillion stimulus bill could result in over \$30 billion for emergency rental assistance as well as \$35 billion in assistance for small businesses. The fate of the stimulus bill in Congress as well as the regulatory and administrative framework for allocation and expenditure of the funds should be clearer in two to four weeks. In order to ensure that Daly City’s CDBG CV 3 funds are allocated to the activity with the greatest need and the fewest resources, staff recommends that action by the City to program its \$1,044,763 in CDBG-CV3 funds be postponed until more information is available about what resources the Rescue America Plan will generate to Daly City. Federal regulations require that the City’s plan for using CDBG-CV3 funds be submitted to HUD by August, 2021. Therefore, staff recommends that the CDBG Advisory Committee reconvene before the end of May, regardless of the status the Rescue America Plan, to finalize a CDBG-CV3 spending plan for Council consideration.
