APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Motion made by Chair Luna to approve tonight's agenda and seconded by Commissioner Pastor to approve the agenda for July 23, 2019. The agenda was unanimously approved.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion made by Chair Luna, and seconded by Commissioner Flamenco, to approve the minutes of the Recreation Commission meeting of June 25, 2019. The motion carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Red Cross Emergency Shelter Agreements – Director Curran introduced our longstanding partnership with the Red Cross and what the Red Cross does for the City of Daly City. One of the biggest questions that comes up is that, in case of a big emergency, what shelters are set up to handle the City of Daly City. Currently, there are 3 centers that the Red Cross can utilize to set up in case of an emergency; Bayshore Community Center, War memorial Community Center, and the Pacelli Event Center. Periodically, a representative from the Red Cross visits these centers and does an assessment to determine the capacity and readiness of those locations in the event of natural disasters. The Red Cross would like to continue keeping the facilities on their inventory and are seeking a facility use agreement from the City of Daly City. The action that Director Curran is looking for from the Commissioners tonight is the approval for it to be sent to the City Council who will ultimately authorize the Red Cross to use the Daly City facilities in the event they need space to temporarily house displaced families in Daly City. The motion was approved to forward the agreement to the City Council.

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT:

Commissioner Ortiz noted that his flag football program went well during the summer and would like to bring the flag football program back for this fall. He is looking to get the flag football program on the agenda for next meeting. Chair Luna approved for the flag football program to be added to the next agenda.

Commissioner Flamenco notes that her children are currently attending the Gellert Park SYRP and states that her children love the program there. She also states that the volunteers and staff are doing a great job at Gellert.

Commissioner Pastor noted that the Independence Day Celebration was a great event and very reminiscent for him as he bumped into a lot of familiar faces including parents of kids that he used to coach. He was very happy to see the community get together and praises the staff for setting up the event. He also notes that he is also impressed by the Daly City Youth Council and would like to see the progress made by the Youth Council.
