REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES – AUGUST 27, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

ROLL CALL

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Motion made by Commissioner Flamenco to approve tonight's agenda and seconded by Commissioner Ortiz to approve the agenda for August 27, 2019. The agenda was unanimously approved.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion made by Commissioner Flamenco, and seconded by Commissioner Ortiz, to approve the minutes of the Recreation Commission meeting of July 23, 2019. The motion carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Summer Youth Recreation Program Recap – Director Curran introduced Recreation Program Supervisor David Zetzer to give a recap of the Summer Youth Recreation Program (SYRP). The Summer Youth Recreation Program has wrapped up their 10 weeks of camp at their four (4) locations: Gellert Park, Hillside Clubhouse, Marchbank Clubhouse, and Westlake Park. The breakdowns at each site were as follows:

- Marchbank Clubhouse
 - Summer total -- 235 participants
 - Weekly attendance (average) – 27 participants
- Hillside Clubhouse
 - Summer total – 260 participants
 - Weekly attendance (average) -- 29 participants
- Westlake Park
 - Summer total -- 813 participants
 - Weekly attendance (average) -- 90 participants

- Gellert Park
 - Summer total -- 554 participants
 - Weekly attendance – 61 participants

The Hillside and Marchbank Clubhouse sites had an age range of 5-14 years, whereas the Gellert Park and Westlake Park sites were divided into two age groups: 5-10 year olds and 11-14 year olds. The program also included field trips and special events that all went well during the 10 weeks of the program. In conjunction with the Volunteer Leadership Program (VLP), there were a total of 100 + volunteers that conjured a total of 18,000 community service hours over the entire summer. Overall, the SYRP was a huge success.

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT:

Director Joseph Curran went over briefly about the history of the Flag Football Program. The program was eliminated 4 years ago after going over budget and also losing participants. The program also saw the amount of team's present drop from 6 to 4 pee-wee teams in total. At the same time, there was an ongoing budget crisis that affected the program. Commissioner Ortiz went on to add that there was a little resurgence this summer with bringing back a similar program under the 49er's Prep Flag Football Program. He noted that there were a lot of kids that were signed up and that both locations that ran the program were filled. Commissioner Ortiz was looking to bring the similar program back in the Fall-time, even going to Board of Supervisors and David Canepa for funding and assistance. Commissioner Ortiz will continue to further his support for the continuation of a Flag Football Program.
