PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Introduction of Ordinance for Military Equipment Policy (AB 481)

Acting Chief of Police Cameron Christensen provided background on AB 481 which requires police departments to adopt the subject policy prior to taking actions relating to funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment. The Police Department is seeking approval of an ordinance for current equipment in use in the department, and to continue use of what the statute defines as military equipment. Any future purchases or acquisitions will be brought to Council for approval prior to use. Acting Chief Christensen provided a list of the equipment that is currently available for use by the department.

It was moved by Councilmember Manalo, seconded by Councilmember DiGiovanni and carried to open the public hearing. There were no speakers on this matter.

It was moved by Councilmember Manalo, seconded by Councilmember DiGiovanni and carried to close the public hearing.

It was moved by Councilmember Sylvester, seconded by Councilmember DiGiovanni and carried by unanimous roll call vote for the City Attorney to read by title only.

City Council

Councilmember DiGiovanni acknowledged Jewish-Americans Heritage Month and Teachers Appreciation Month. Councilmember DiGiovanni participated in San Mateo County's Progress Seminar which was also attended by the Chamber and other elected officials; the seminar provided training, workshops, and a presentation on mental health for all in attendance. Councilmember DiGiovanni congratulated the Daly City Public Library Associates (DCPLA) for their second Youth Poet Laureate event, and the finalists for sharing their work and thanked DCPLA members Victoria Magbilang and

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Aileen Cassinetto for all their work; Councilmember DiGiovanni supported using creativity as a coping mechanism as a way to address mental health.

Mayor Daus-Magbual acknowledged the green ribbons worn by all Councilmembers to show their support for Mental Health Awareness Month and to show solidarity with other agencies who are providing mental health first aid classes and providing education; these mental health resources serve as part of San Mateo County's Health Initiative to address issues of mental health and wellness. Mayor Daus-Magbual participated in the County's Progress Seminar which included sessions for advancing equity and understanding labor issues; the Mayor acknowledged other cities and local leaders for their contributions in looking at innovative ways to address local issues such as education, homelessness and the economy. Mayor Daus-Magbual reported attendance at the DCPLA's second Youth Poet Laureate event at City Hall and the National Small Business Week event at Molloy's held by the Daly City/Colma Chamber of Commerce.

Councilmember Manalo reported attendance at the following events - the DCPLA's Youth Poet Laureate event at City Council Chambers, commending the finalists and the Mayor for sharing their poetry; the Progress Seminar where the private, public and non-profit sectors came together; the California Bay Area Five-County API-elected Officials Summit with Attorney General Rob Bonta and State Treasurer Fiona Ma; the Daly City/Colma Chamber of Commerce event at Colma Café for National Small Business Week; the kick-off of affordable housing development Montara with the County's Housing Leadership Council to commemorate Affordable Housing Month. Councilmember Manalo acknowledged Asian Pacific Islander (API) Heritage Month and invited people to support *The Vagina Monologues* at Herbst Theater, in collaboration with the Filipino Women's Network, to stop Asian hate and to stand up against gender violence. Councilmember Manalo acknowledged a visit to see a new cultural arch with her daughter in LA's historic Filipinotown during API Heritage Month.

Staff

City Manager Shawwna Maltbie expressed appreciation for the Youth Poet Laureate event, which was the first in-person event inside the Council Chambers in over two years.

Assistant City Manager Stephen Stolte reported on City Hall's re-opening plans for walk-up, in-person services beginning next week on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 8 AM-5PM. Cashier payments related to Finance, Building, Code Enforcement and Public Works will be available from 8:30-3:30 PM. The City plans to return to full five-day in-person services in August, and all updates will be posted on the City's website. Mr. Stolte reminded the Council of the continuing teleconferencing policy for public meetings and provided an update on the City's tech vendor to install equipment in the Council Chambers for hybrid meetings.
