The Council considered whether Item 24, A Resolution in Support of Peace and an End to the Humanitarian Crisis in Gaza, would be heard at tonight's meeting due to the lack of a full Council. After deliberation, the Council agreed to at least hear and discuss the item. City Attorney Zimmerman provided clarification on how to proceed. Mayor Manalo moved Item 24 up on the agenda, to be heard directly after Presentations.

Proclamation - Pride Month 2024

It was moved by Mayor Manalo, seconded by Vice Mayor Daus-Magbual and carried by unanimous roll call vote to move Item 24 up, to be heard prior to the rest of the agenda.

RESOLUTIONS:

A Resolution in Support of Peace and an End to the Humanitarian Crisis in Gaza

Mayor Manalo acknowledged Vice Mayor Daus-Magbual and Councilmember Proaño for their work on the ad hoc committee to work on drafting the proposed resolution. City Attorney Rose Zimmerman provided information on the creation of the ad hoc Council committee whose task included reviewing numerous resolutions from local agencies to formulate a draft resolution, and noted that an updated resolution was provided to the Council for their review.

Vice Mayor Daus-Magbual and Councilmember Proaño reported on their ad hoc committee meetings, reported on meeting with various members and groups of the community to try and address the crisis together, while recognizing that the draft resolution is not perfect and the unlikelihood of it pleasing everyone. Councilmember Proaño read aloud the drafted resolution. The Council discussed and deliberated the language of the draft resolution. Mayor Manalo provided direction for public comment to have a one-minute time limit for each speaker.

The following speakers urged the Council to listen to their community and pass the bilateral ceasefire resolution without further delay and without amendments, noting how the community has been attending the meetings resolutely for the past 3 months to ensure the item passes. Individuals spoke about the genocide happening in Gaza for the last 7 months and endorsed the resolution as a symbolic stance for humanity, a call for peace preventing further loss of life, and a show of solidarity for the people of Gaza as well as Daly City's Palestinian residents. People advocating for the ceasefire resolution spoke about the trauma and suffering caused by the conflict, the staggering number of civilian lives lost, mass starvation in Gaza, and the urgent need for humanitarian aid in the area. Individuals denounced the recent bombings of declared safe zones in Gaza, the increase of anti-Arab hate and xenophobia in the US, and the amount of US funding going to Israel. Speakers urged the Council to follow suit in the action taken by neighboring cities that have passed ceasefire resolutions such as Oakland, San Francisco, Richmond and Pacifica.

The following speakers were opposed to passing the resolution and urged the Council not to get involved in international matters which are outside of their purview, and instead, to focus their time and effort on local issues. Individuals were opposed to a ceasefire resolution, calling it one-sided and bigoted, citing the increase of antisemitism and fears for safety amongst members of the Jewish community, and pointing out that Israel is merely defending itself against a terrorist group. Some speakers stated the resolution would only cause division, while others potentially voiced support for a resolution that condemns and eliminates Hamas, calls for release of hostages, or one drafted with members of the Jewish community to represent both communities. Others denied the occurrence of a genocide in Gaza.

Mary Bernier, Interfaith Peace Coalition, provided information on housing for people 62 or older, and brought flyers translated in Spanish to pass out during the meeting, adding that some people are forgotten by the government.

The Mayor and Councilmembers thanked everyone who came to speak on the item and provided their perspectives on the resolution. Due to disruptions from audience member(s), Mayor Manalo called for a recess at 11:15 P.M. and reconvened the meeting at 11:57 P.M., at which point, all four Councilmembers were still present. The Council continued to deliberate the resolution. Councilmember Proaño recommended the following amendments: to strike paragraphs 10 and 15 from the draft resolution, and to replace them with 1 paragraph affirming that the City of Daly City agrees with the

United States in urging the United Nations Security Council to support President Biden's three-phase plan which ultimately hopes to achieve a ceasefire. The Council was amenable to the amendments as the three-phase plan also addressed the humanitarian aspects and the release of hostages.

City Attorney Zimmerman provided the Council with their options with regard to the actions they can take on the item. The Council deliberated whether it was the right time to vote on the resolution after having received extensive feedback and discussion on the item.
