CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Daus-Magbual called the regular meeting to order at 7:01 P.M. and read the City's Land Acknowledgement:

We recognize their enduring connection to this region and honor their history, culture, and contributions. 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Council

Councilmember Manalo congratulated Daly City on becoming the first city in the County to utilize e-bikes, noted the expansion of the pilot program in various Daly City neighborhoods, and recognized the efforts of C/CAG. Manalo expressed excitement for the Top of the Hill Festival this weekend and provided parking options for attendees. Manalo reported attendance at the following events: the Cal Cities Conference to work with other cities on advocacy efforts, alongside Councilmember Proaño, and gave a speech on private/public partnerships; the Mexican Flag-raising at City Hall, recognizing Councilmember Proaño and the recent ¡Pachanga Latinx Mexican celebration; the Italian flag-raising at City Hall, thanking Mayor Daus-Magbual for hosting, and City Manager Piccolotti for inviting the Consul General of Italy; Kasayahan at Gellert Park, congratulating Director Brown, Recreation Manager Benson and the Recreation staff for organizing an event which drew 10,000 people; the Long Beach Convention, where Manalo was inducted as the Vice President for the Peninsula Division, which spans from Daly City to San Jose; the Fire Service Day event, congratulating the Fire Department on their open house event by welcoming the public at various fire stations; the first SOMA Pride event, which saw Filipino Americans supporting LGBTQ communities; Coffee with the Chief, Christensen, which had a great turnout and supported local business Tallios; DCPLA's Art & Lit Fest featuring DJ QBert and where the community witnessed Mayor Daus-Magbual's breakdancing skills; PhilDev's 15-year anniversary, recognizing Dado Banatao for his contributions to creating the microchip for computers; and Assemblywoman Stefani's event focusing on domestic violence awareness. Manalo recognized October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month and Domestic Violence Awareness Month. She congratulated several individuals and organizations for their community engagement efforts, including: Supervisor Canepa for his Hike for Loneliness Event aimed at connecting people in nature; the Daly City Partnership on their tremendous work; St. Augustine Church in South San Francisco for their 55th anniversary; Hilldale School in Daly City for having its inaugural FilAm History Month Event; the Asian Pacific Islander Legal Outreach for celebrating their 50th anniversary while providing free legal services to residents; and Seafood City for organizing phenomenal events in Daly City.

***Councilmember DiGiovanni reported attendance at the following events: the Mexican flag-raising at City Hall; the annual Kasayahan celebration at Gellert Park, acknowledging the numerous vendors and performers, and Mayor Daus-Magbual for his energy; and the Italian flag-raising at City Hall, providing some history of Italian immigrant experiences in America and Columbus Day, requesting that next year's event should include a performance of the Italian national anthem. DiGiovanni acknowledged Breast Cancer Awareness Month, noting the Police Department's program to sell pink patches to raise awareness, with proceeds going to the Susan G. Komen Foundation.

Vice Mayor Sylvester acknowledged the e-bike pilot program in the City. Sylvester commended City staff for their work on the Kasayahan celebration and acknowledged the vendors who participated. Sylvester provided information on free transportation options for attendees of the upcoming Top of the Hill Festival, including shuttle service. Sylvester encouraged everyone to experience Seafood City's Midnight Madness events, which showcases Filipino street food, music, and dancing. Sylvester thanked City Manager Piccolotti and staff for their responsiveness during the past years towards the Council as well as the community they serve.

Councilmember Proaño amended the minutes at the October 27, 2025 Council meeting, and clarified that she did not ask Councilmember DiGiovanni to speak on her behalf during Council Reports, and requested to retract those statements.

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Mayor Daus-Magbual reported attendance at Kasayahan and recognized the work of the multimedia crew, headliners Gabe Bondoc and Jeremy Passion, and acknowledged the community for their support. Dr. Daus-Magbual encouraged everyone to attend the Top of the Hill Festival on Saturday, from 11 AM to 6 PM, and acknowledged iHeart Radio for helping promote the event. Taking place on John Daly Boulevard at Mission Street, the festival will feature live performances, Top of the Hill businesses, resource tables, food vendors, a beer garden, a car show, kids zones, pony rides, and headliners, Spawn Breezie and Anuhea. The Mayor gave a shoutout to Seafood City and SF Collective for hosting their Late Night Events at the supermarket, highlighting the vibrancy of the live music, dancing, and street food. Dr. Daus-Magbual congratulated Daly City local DJ Bitesize for representing the US and taking fourth place in the DMC World Championship for turntablism in Tokyo, and proposed working with staff to honor DJ Bitesize.

Acting Chief Christensen announced that Daly City Police pink patches are now available for purchase at the Police Department, with proceeds going to the Susan G. Komen Foundation. The Acting Chief also highlighted the recent Coffee with the Chief event at City Hall, acknowledging the residents who attended and supported local businesses.

City Manager Piccolotti announced the news of Director Tim Nevin's appointment as Assistant City Manager, extending congratulations on his new role. The Council joined in congratulating Nevin, recognizing his experience and leadership within the City, especially as the current Director of Finance.

It was moved by Councilmember Manalo, seconded by Vice Mayor Sylvester and carried by voice vote to appoint Adonis Marcelino to the Recreation Commission.
