Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 P.M.

Public Comment

Rebecca introduced herself as a resident of Daly City having worked as a crossing guard at multiple schools in Daly City. She expressed an interest in the Daly City Safe Routes to School Project and bike lanes throughout the city.

I. Approval of Meeting Minutes of March 4, 2026.

Meeting minutes for the March 4, 2026 meeting were approved by all members present.

II. Membership Term Status

Staff provided an update to the B/PAC members. The terms for Henry, Natasha and Alan were extended for two years at the June 8, 2026 City Council meeting. Natasha recommended the Daly City B/PAC webpage be updated to reflect the current membership and roles.

III. Support Seamless Bay Area

Staff informed the B/PAC that SamTrans presented to the City Council in March to seek support for the Connect Bay Area ballot measure. Natasha noted that the measure has qualified for the November ballot. She also explained that the strategy has changed and they are looking for endorsements from individual candidates. Natasha expressed a desire for the B/PAC to provide a letter of support to City Council, emphasizing SamTrans riders' dependency on public transportation.

IV. Status of Current Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvement Projects

John Daly Boulevard/Skyline Boulevard Pedestrian Connection – The project is nearing completion. Staff shared project photos with the B/PAC. The remaining work consists of installing the pedestrian-scale lights.

John Daly Blvd/ Skyline Blvd Intersection Safety Improvements – Staff is working to address Caltrans' comments.

Lake Merced Boulevard Lane Configuration and Bicycle Lane Protection Study and Design – Staff explained that the current project has been placed on hold due to feedback by the public regarding the potential changes. Natasha and Alan highlighted the need for the project, noting its potential to reduce the number of crashes. Natasha asked about the outreach, who was surveyed, and what the traffic counts were. Melinda asked about the primary concerns regarding moving forward with the project. Staff explained that public feedback was the main factor contributing to the concerns. Fernando asked whether the survey conducted could be shared with the B/PAC. Alan emphasized the need for the project, noting the road is on the City's high injury network. He also expressed a desire to provide a letter from B/PAC to City Council in support of the proposed changes.

Daly City Safe Routes to School - Staff informed the B/PAC that the improvement plans for the proposed road diet on E. Market Street have been placed on hold. Rebecca shared her experience as a crossing guard, and B/PAC members reinforced the importance of the project and encouraged continued engagement with the nearby schools that may be impacted. Natasha and Melinda requested additional details regarding the outreach survey that was conducted.

John Daly Boulevard Pedestrian and Bicycle Facility Improvements – Staff noted that the survey of the project area was completed and the designers are working on a concept plan. The project plans are estimated to be completed by October.

Hillside Boulevard Complete Streets Corridor – Staff noted that the project is a joint effort with San Mateo County. Community outreach has been delayed until the start of the school year.

Natasha requested that outreach also engage people who walk and bike along the corridor, including a potential tabling event.

V. Review CIP Projects in Design

Westlake Slurry Seal – Staff informed the B/PAC that the back-in diagonal parking along Lake Merced Boulevard have been removed from the plans. The project is anticipated to start in August 2026. B/PAC members asked if there could be a pilot project to introduce back in diagonal parking spaces in Daly City.

2023-24 Street Resurfacing Project – No update.

2024-25 Street Resurfacing Project – No update.

VI. Serramonte Shopping Center Northwest Quadrant – Restaurants with Drive-Through

Staff shared the preliminary site plans from the July Planning Commission meeting for the Serramonte Shopping Center Northwest Quadrant. B/PAC members noted the need for a traffic study for the proposed development and encouraged staff to require the traffic study as a condition of approval. Natasha raised concerns regarding non-ADA compliant entrances and ramps and would like to see a minimum of 6' wide sidewalks. Melinda also encouraged improvements to the existing transit shelters.

VII. Transportation Development Act Article 3 Bicycle and Pedestrian Program Call for Project

Staff explained that the City submitted a TDA Article 3 grant application for the John Daly Boulevard Pedestrian and Bicycle Facility Improvements Project. Staff presented the project to the County's B/PAC committee in May for their consideration. The County's B/PAC will be evaluating all the proposals received and make a decision for recommendation to their board by the end of July.

VIII. Bike to Work Day 2026

Melinda expressed her gratitude for the staff and Sandis for their help with tabling the event. She hopes B/PAC will continue to help host the event and would like to request additional bags for next year as they were out of bags in the morning.

Announcements and Communications

The B/PAC committee discussed forming a subcommittee to write letters on behalf of the B/PAC's concerns. Alan, Melinda and Natasha were nominated to the subcommittee. Draft letters will be prepared for review at the next meeting.

Adjournment to the next regular meeting (September 2, 2026)

The meeting was adjourned at 8:22 P.M.
