PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Consideration of New Fees for Daly City After School Youth Recreation Program Aquatic Lessons and Fields Facility Rentals (Continued from May 14, 2018)

Director of Library and Recreation Services, Joseph Curran, is continuing this item from the meeting of May 14, 2018. He gave a detailed proposal of the rates with priority being given to Daly City residents and at discounted rates.

Mayor Manalo opened the public hearing.

Appeal for consideration to not increase the fees was expressed by residents Marian Mann and Ray Satorre since the majority of Daly City residents are average to low-income earners.

Councilmembers directed staff to make the following changes which included:

- 1) Merced Clubroom will be \$100/hr for residents
- 2) Lawson stays at \$75.00/hr for residents and \$100/hr for non-residents

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Mayor Manalo closed the public hearing.

It was moved by Councilmember Sylvester, seconded by Councilmember Christensen and carried by unanimous roll call to vote to adopt the following resolution:

PUBLIC APPEARANCES/ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

James C. Spiogola, resident, San Bruno, talked about toxicity, fluoridation and contaminants of mercury in the dental and medical treatments to Council. He asked for support, to bring awareness of contamination and to ban dental amalgam in San Mateo County.

Cris Romero, resident, brought to Council a racial slur encountered by his family at Lucky's Grocery in Mission, Daly City. An adult female harassed his family with racial slurs and anti-immigrant rants. Council emphasized that Daly City is a highly diverse city and does not condone racism or hostility towards immigrants.

Pamela Di Giovanni, resident, emphasized to love and respect one another. She also talked on the Annual Report of North County Fire Authority and requested a complete annual report.

Police Chief Patrick Hensley stressed that the Police Department continuously honor Officer Richard Klass, who died on duty last June 6, 1966 by donning a mourning band.

APPOINTMENTS: Board/Commission Membership Appointments:

It was moved by Councilmember Christensen, seconded by Councilmember Guingona to appoint Charlie Tallerico as Planning Commissioner. After Council's discussion, Councilmember Christensen decided to withdraw her appointment. Councilmember Christensen left the chambers at 8:52 PM, and Councilmember Guingona left council chambers at 8:54 PM and both were absent for rest of the Council Meeting.
